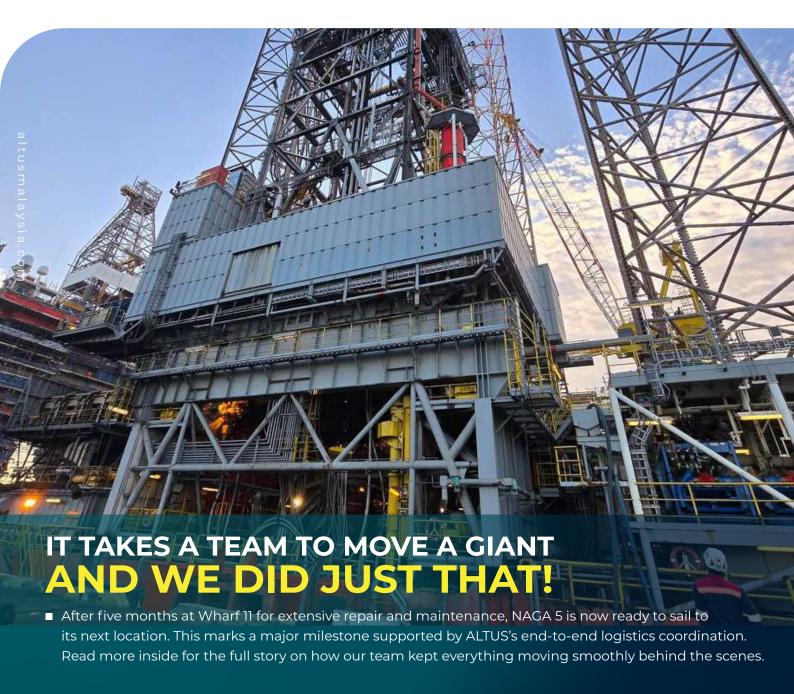

SOLUTIONS START WITH SEEING:

ALEX CHEE'S BLUEPRINT FOR BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

When you ask Alex where he's from, you get more than just a location you get a glimpse into the values that shaped him. Raised in PJ and Shah Alam but proudly born in Penang, Alex shares how his family insisted all children be born there to carry the '07' identity. His upbringing was grounded in structure and independence. "We didn't just get pocket money. We had to earn it. RM5 for washing the car, RM5 for scrubbing the toilet," he recalls. "Looking back, I really value that. It taught us how to work for what we want."

That early mindset of earning, learning, and evolving has driven Alex through every stage of his career. From starting as a Sales Officer in a Japanese logistics firm to playing key roles in Malaysia's e-commerce boom, his journey spans sales, operations, and strategic project management.

In 2024, he brought that experience to AFM Fulfillment as Business Development Manager where he continues turning everyday challenges into growth opportunities. Here's what he had to say about his current role, strategies, and aspirations.



## Q&A WITH ALEX CHEE, BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT MANAGER

Q: Can you share a bit about your journey before joining AFM Fulfillment? What drew you to the world of e-commerce and logistics?

During my form 6 orientation, I said I wanted to be a successful businessman but got laughed at for not having a clear goal. That moment pushed me. I chose logistics so I could learn how successful businesses operate. I didn't expect to end up in e-commerce, but I was lucky to be part of something big from introducing cash-on-delivery to helping Zalora and Lazada grow in their early days. Looking back, I'm proud to have played a role in building trust in online shopping and shaping how fulfillment works today.

Q: What does a day in your role as Head of Business Development look like?

From the minute I reach office/warehouse, my task is to observe everything - people, process, procedures, problems and turning them into business opportunities, solutions, and improvements. For me, business development happens in two ways: internally, by improving how we work to reduce cost or boost profitability; and externally, by studying our customers and offering solutions that help them save while allowing us to grow.

Q: What's one business development strategy or campaign you're most proud of, and why?

One initiative I'm proud of is introducing complementary services that directly boost our revenue. One example is convincing customers to switch from their own last-mile account to our last-mile account, we gained a net profit of RM1.00 per parcel without adding any extra work. The same goes for international shipments: by switching from courier X to courier Y, customers saved significantly, and we increased our margins. It's about making smart shifts that benefit both sides.

Q: How do you spot opportunities in such a fast-paced industry? What's your approach to building lasting client relationships?

It all comes down to experience and honesty. I always try to put myself in the client's shoes and speak their language. If you can understand their challenges and offer real solutions, they'll keep coming back. Clients don't mind paying as long as you're solving their problems. And when we take a fair, calculated portion, it becomes a win-win. That's how you build sustainable business.

**Solutions start with seeing** and for Alex Chee, that means paying attention to the small things that others might overlook. From observing warehouse flow to rethinking how clients ship their parcels, it's his ability to turn everyday insights into strategic moves that sets his work apart.

"Whatever role I take, I set a goal and I won't move on until I achieve it," Alex says. "At AFF, my goal is clear: to help us become one of the top three fulfillment centres in Malaysia. That's what I'm building toward."

# AVM'S AERIAL EXPERTISE RECOGNISED BY MINISTER

Altus Aviation Services (AVM) took centre stage on 22nd April 2025, when the Minister of Plantation and Commodities, YB Datuk Seri Johari Abdul Ghani, visited Kampung Coldstream, Bidor, Perak, to see firsthand the progress of the Integrated Bagworm Control Programme, a strategic collaboration between AVM and Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB).

This pioneering programme targets severe bagworm infestations threatening oil palm yields, offering smallholder farmers an effective and sustainable aerial control solution.

During his tour, YB Datuk Seri Johari praised the results achieved so far and highlighted the importance of expanding such integrated pest control efforts beyond MPOB's initiatives. He urged private plantation companies to embrace similar strategies to drive broader, sustainable impacts across the industry.

### RP-R804 HELICOPTER ADVANCES IN WET-LEASE RENEWAL PROCESS

On 5th June 2025, the RP-R804 helicopter operated under AVM's fleet was thoroughly inspected by Helistar Resources Sdn Bhd's Quality Assurance team, including Nik Umi Humairah (Continuing Airworthiness Management Organization, CAMO) and Muhd Feisal Mustak (Flight Operations). This due diligence review was part of the helicopter's wet-lease renewal process. The inspection confirmed that the aircraft remains in full compliance with all regulatory requirements, reflecting strong maintenance and operational standards.

Next, the team is preparing the RP-R804 and its supporting documentation for the upcoming inspection by the Civil Aviation Authority of Malaysia (CAAM)'s Principal Maintenance Inspector and Principal Operations Inspector, set for 4th July. This next step will be crucial in securing the aircraft's continued operational approval.







### AVM WRAPS UP 16,500 -HECTARE MPOB AERIAL OPERATIONS IN PERAK

AVM successfully completed its final aerial spraying mission at Kampung Coldstream, Bidor, on 13th June 2025, marking the conclusion of this year's operational scope under the MPOB collaboration in Perak. Over 66 working days, AVM covered a cumulative area of 16,500 hectares, delivering precise and efficient aerial spraying services across multiple locations:

- ► Kubang Ikan, Bota
- ► Pantai Remis, Manjung
- ► Kampung Banjar, Beruas

# FIELD DEMONSTRATIONS REACH OVER 70 FELDA PARTICIPANTS

In our effort to bring impactful solutions to the plantation sector, AVM conducted two back-to-back aerial spraying demonstrations for FELDA Wilayah Kuantan showcasing how our solutions can address large-scale bagworm outbreaks effectively and efficiently.

The first session, held on 14th April 2025 at Changkat Cermin, welcomed FELDA Wilayah Kuantan's Director and 18 representatives from various estates. Participants observed our aerial application in action, with firsthand insights into its scalability and operational ease.

Impressed by the results, FELDA requested a second session focused on settlers and smallholders, which took place on 16th June 2025 at FELDA Keratong 8, Pahang. Nearly 70 participants joined the field briefing and live demo, reflecting strong interest from both management and ground-level stakeholders.

These sessions not only reinforced the value of aerial spraying in integrated pest control but also highlighted our commitment to working closely with plantation communities to introduce practical, scalable solutions.

# FULL FORCE ON SHELL FAS 2.0 PROJECT

#### FROM BRIEFING ROOM TO BOARDING GATE

Kicking off the Shell FAS 2.0 campaign, Altus Bintulu team anchored preparations with a safety and mobilisation briefing on 13th April at Danum 1, bringing together nearly 30 personnel. Led by Mr. Adam, Mr. Aidelsham, and Mr. Isidore, the team ensured briefing materials, mobilisation schedules, and operational plans were seamlessly aligned to Shell's standards.

The next day, in Miri Port, Altus facilitated the sign-on of 40 offshore crew members. From verifying documentation to PPE checks, the operation ran smoothly, earning praise from Shell for meticulous coordination and safety compliance. Together, these early efforts laid a solid foundation for the massive mobilisation to come.







## ALL HANDS ON DECK: MULTI-VESSEL OPERATIONS

Ist May was a powerhouse day at Bintulu Port, where Altus handled multiple vessels under tight timelines. Mrs. Doreena and Ms. Afiqah led the delivery of food and essential items to the Berlian McDermott vessel, ensuring maritime hygiene standards were met from supermarket sourcing to onboard handover.

Meanwhile, Mr. Adam and Mr. Aidelsham oversaw loading operations for the Executive Tide vessel, managing cargo verification, lifting plans, and compliance with HSE regulations.

On the same day, they also supported alongside mobilisation activities for three vessels, including the Van Gogh, coordinating berthing, quay access, cargo handling, and crew documentation with precision, It was a showcasing Altus's ability to execute diverse, high-volume port services without missing a beat.





### HALAL-CERTIFIED AND READY: SAMAK PROCESS FOR VESSEL VAN GOGH



Cultural and operational compliance intersected on 2nd May when Vessel Van Gogh underwent the samak process, a ritual Islamic cleansing to qualify for halal operations under Shell FAS 2.0.

Coordinated by Mr. Aidelsham, with Ustaz Khalidi from Pejabat Agama Islam Bahagian Bintulu guiding the process, the operation was completed smoothly and without disruption. The vessel emerged certified halal-compliant, reflecting Altus's capacity to deliver services that respect both technical demands and cultural sensitivities.

### STRATEGIC PLANNING FOR SIX INCOMING VESSELS

As the pace intensified, Altus Bintulu hosted a mobilisation briefing on 3rd May to prepare for six incoming vessels critical to Shell FAS 2.0. Mr. Adam, Mr. Aidelsham, and Mr. Isidore led discussions with Berlian McDermott's management, aligning teams on berthing schedules, lifting plans, HSE protocols, and risk mitigation strategies.

The session ensured clear roles, well-defined timelines, and confidence among all stakeholders that upcoming operations would unfold smoothly and safely.





## CHARTING NEW ROUTES: CONVOY FROM KUCHING

The first marine convoy supporting Shell FAS 2.0 departed on 3rd May from Ocean Might in Kuching, with Altus orchestrating the complex towage and barge mobilisation.

Working alongside Yeo & Lee Shipping and port authorities, the team managed readiness checks, towage connections, and route clearance. The convoy sailed on schedule, setting the tone for a robust marine logistics phase ahead.





## MOBILISATION IN FULL SWING: FABRICATION, CREW CHANGE, AND MORE



By 18th May, Bintulu Port was alive with activity as Altus coordinated diverse vessel operations. Vessel Quatro Gumusut completed a backload of used offshore materials before mobilising fresh cargo, while vessel Express 85 managed a seamless crew change under strict HSE protocols. Simultaneously, vessel Icon Tigris and its barge arrived for a seven-day pipe spool fabrication activity, with Altus Bintulu overseeing dockside logistics and material handling.

Every task was executed without delays or safety incidents, showcasing Altus's agility in managing complex port operations across multiple vessels.

### **KEEPING THE FLOW:**

### FOUR VESSELS, ONE SMOOTH DAY

On 22nd May, Bintulu Port saw another surge in activity as Altus juggled operations across four vessels. A barge hosted pipe spool fabrication and cement transfer operations, coordinated under stringent dust and spill control measures. Vessel Quatro Gumusut focused on loading project cargo and spooling pipes, while vessel Icon Tigris carried out bunkering operations with strict adherence to MARPOL standards. Meanwhile, vessel Express 85 handled backloading and fresh cargo mobilisation.

Through precise planning and constant communication, the Altus Bintulu team maintained flawless coordination proving once more their capacity to manage high-volume logistics while upholding the highest safety and operational standards.





### **SEAMLESS TRANSITION FROM PORT TO OFFSHORE:**

### SKANDI SINGAPORE ARRIVES FOR ROSMARIE MAJORAM

As offshore momentum builds for Rosmarie Majoram project, mobilisation efforts at Bintulu Port took a significant leap forward on 25th May 2025, with the arrival of the Skandi Singapore. The vessel's entry marked another key phase for project partner DOF Subsea Asia Pacific with Altus coordinating the supporting port logistics, documentation, and ground readiness through the leadership of Mr. Adam and the operations team.

Earlier in the day, Barge Assen 3305 departed Bintulu following the successful fabrication, inspection, and securement of pipe spools. With marine clearance processed, tug support confirmed, and weather conditions favourable, the barge was cleared to begin its journey to the Sarawak high sea where it will play a central role in the upcoming installation scope.

## KEEPING STANDARDS HIGH: SHELL HSE AUDIT AT LABUAN





Altus Labuan welcomed SSTCM and Shell to our yard on 22nd May 2025 for a comprehensive HSE audit. Led by the QHSE team alongside our Labuan operations crew, the team guided auditors through site inspections, presented detailed safety records, and addressed all gueries with transparency.

The visit was part of Altus's ongoing support for Shell projects via SSTCM, ensuring we meet the HSE standards. While a few minor improvements were noted for action, the audit overall confirmed Altus strong safety culture and commitment to continuous improvement.





# LABUAN TEAM DELIVERS PRECISION IN SHIPPING SUPPORT

On 1st June 2025, Altus Labuan Logistics Team was hard at work supporting shipping operations for SAA Engineering this time at both the Asian Supply Base and Labuan Anchorage.

Our role included end-to-end logistics and shipping coordination for MV IOS One, covering inward clearance, crew movements, sign-on/sign-off processes,

and equipment arrangements such as MHE and ship-to-ship (STS) transfers. From anchorage to port, the team ensured a seamless and compliant flow of operations, once again demonstrating Altus's reliability in managing marine logistics with precision and professionalism.

# DOUBLE DUTY AT JOHOR PORT: LIFTING OPERATIONS WITH MCDERMOTT & DELEUM

10th April 2025 was a full day for the Johor team, as they supported two key lifting operations at Johor Port. The first operation involved McDermott, where our team managed the safe handling and placement of pipe cargo. The job was executed with precision and care, and feedback from McDermott commended the team's professionalism and work quality underscoring the strong collaboration between both parties.







Later that same day, the team continued with a second round of lifting support for Deleum. With Mr. Syahril and Mr. Zulfadli on site, the operation was carried out smoothly, with all equipment safely transported and positioned as required. The seamless coordination contributed to timely and efficient completion, reinforcing Altus Johor's reliability in back-to-back port operations.





## **KEEPING UP WITH VELESTO: END-TO-END SUPPORT IN JOHOR**

The Johor team has been in full gear across several key activities, ensuring seamless support for Velesto's vessel operations at Johor Port.

On 21st April 2025, Mr. Zulfadli, Mr. Luthfil, and Mr. Izzat led a backload operation for Velesto, coordinating the transfer of cargo from anchorage to port. Their meticulous handling ensured all items were received, documented, and managed without delays, underscoring the team's agility in vessel logistics. Momentum continued into May, when the same team was on-site to oversee the departure of Naga 5 from Wharf 11 on 6th May, following its repair and maintenance works. Their presence ensured final checks, documentation, and coordination were flawlessly executed, allowing the vessel to set sail smoothly and on time.

The support didn't stop there. On 13th June, the team facilitated a Landing Craft Transport (LCT) operation, delivering essential items to Velesto's vessel.

Every piece of cargo was safely loaded and positioned as per operational requirements, reinforcing the team's reliability in managing vessel needs from start to finish. Together, these consecutive operations highlight Altus Johor team's unwavering commitment to precise, end-to-end service for Velesto keeping vessels moving efficiently and safely through every stage.

### TOK BALI & SAPURA: COORDINATED SUPPORT FOR S300

From April through May, the Tok Bali team delivered steadfast support to Sapura Marine Ventures for operations involving the S300 vessel at Tok Bali Supply Base (TBSB).

In April, the team managed temporary storage of key supplies including medical kits, chemical substances, and other vessel equipment at the Altus yard. Once the





S300 berthed, these items were seamlessly transferred back on board. Just days later, on 17th April, a time-sensitive delivery of chemical packages was carried out directly to the vessel at the jetty, demonstrating the team's agility and precision.





Continuing their momentum into May, the team delivered spare parts from the office to the vessel on 15th May, ensuring minimal downtime. Then, on 20th May, they supported the transfer of lube oil drums using an on-hired Altus container unit, along with coordinated forklift and prime mover operations for smooth transport to the jetty.

Each operation highlighted the Tok Bali team's close coordination, proactive planning, and unwavering commitment to keeping Sapura's offshore activities running without disruption.

## STRENGTHENING TIES OVER RAYA CELEBRATION

The Tok Bali team joined DS7, who's also a TBSB tenant for a meaningful Hari Raya celebration held at Tok Aman Bali Beach Resort on 21st April 2025.

It was an occasion to step away from routine and reconnect in a more personal, festive setting. With full staff attendance, the gathering reflected not just a celebration of the season, but also the continued collaboration and goodwill between both teams.







### ON-DEMAND DELIVERY & CCU SUPPORT FROM TOK BALI

Altus Tok Bali continues to deliver dependable CCU solutions to support our clients' fast-paced operational needs whether for planned movements or same-day mobilisation.

On 13th May 2025, the team swiftly responded to an urgent request from HESS to on-hire an IBCD unit. A yard inspection was conducted immediately to verify the unit's condition, followed by forklift and prime mover coordination to ensure smooth and timely delivery to the jetty.

A few weeks later, on 4th June, TBSB arranged to rent a CCU container from the yard.

While the client managed their own forklift and transport, the ALTUS team conducted a pre-handover inspection and assisted onsite to ensure the collection went smoothly demonstrating how our yard facilitates flexible support for both turnkey and customer-handled operations.

Further underscoring our CCU readiness, on 11th June, Altus organised the transfer of six key assets from Tok Bali to Kemaman in support of CHOC's upcoming on-hire requirements. The units comprising CBHs, BRAs, and BRDs—were prepared and dispatched in coordination with TBSB's logistics team, reinforcing our role as a responsive, cross-region support partner.

From last-minute mobilisations to regional asset transfers, Altus continues to stand by our clients with tailored, efficient CCU support.







## SCHEDULED WASTE COLLECTION WITH PENTAS FLORA

Keeping operations compliant and clean, 5th June 2025 marked the first scheduled waste collection under our new partnership with Pentas Flora Kelantan. Now officially registered as our waste vendor, they were tasked with removing three categories of scheduled waste from the Altus Tok Bali yard as part of our six-month disposal routine.

### **SALES & PROCUREMENT MODULES GO LIVE**

Earlier in May, the Sales and Procurement modules were deployed to the production server on 13th May. Teams across the business began handling purchase requisitions, sales transactions, and vendor management exclusively via Odoo. This transition is central to Altus' goal of achieving better data accuracy and operational efficiency.



#### **REVISED GO-LIVE FOR EXPENSES MODULE**

The Expenses Module officially launched on 26th May, enabling staff to submit claims directly through Odoo. Petty Cash claims were also announced to go live starting 1st June, further expanding the system's capabilities. The initial demos played a key role in helping users adopt the new processes with greater ease.

With several modules now live, the next milestone includes rolling out the Finance and CCU modules, ensuring end-to-end integration across departments.
